Key people involved in the *Titanic* catastrophe include: Frederick Fleet, a Lookout, John Jacob Astor, a wealthy passenger, and J. Bruce Ismay, Managing Director.

Groups included the crew and the wealthy passengers.

In the novel, *Unsinkable Steel, Glass, and Chrome: The story of the Titanic*, passenger and crew responses show how the impact of the collision between an iceberg and the *Titanic* affected people differently. Some did not think the sensation was serious, while others were more concerned. For example, one crew member was annoyed because a pan of new rolls clattered off the top of the oven and scattered about the floor. A passenger thought it was like a heavy wave striking the ship. Since the *Titanic* was considered unsinkable, no one thought the collision was deadly.

According to J. Bruce Ismay, the most senior representative of the company that owned the ship, he “felt sure the ship had struck something, but he didn’t know what.”
